Vermillion Girls' Soccer Program Looks To Step Up After Strong Showing In '10

VERMILLION — Despite boasting a young roster, the Vermillion Tanagers girls' soccer team has high expectations after nearly beating some of the best teams in the state a year ago.

The Tanagers, who opened their season Aug. 20 with a loss to St. Thomas More, recorded ties with top-seed St. Thomas More and third-seeded Harris-

burg at last year's state tournament.

Now, for 2011, head coach Dave LaCombe sees his team as a potential threat come post-season time.
